endeavors to rehabilitate troubled youth and young adults through a residency program involving counseling, training in agriculture and animal husbandry, spiritual encouragement, and self mastery through service to others. Central to these efforts are the gardening and animal husbandry activities residents participate in at our Avalon Organic Gardens, Farm and Ranch. A program is written specifically for each individual by a team of qualified professionals.



### Program Founders

**Gabriel of Urantia** has served the homeless, runaways, drug addicts, alcoholics, and those damaged by society or early family life. He worked with the half-way house program of Nicky Cruz Homes/Teen Challenge Programs and was also a volunteer chaplain of the Pima County Sheriff's department. Additionally he ran his own half-way house, Son-Light Ministries, on 4th Ave. in Tucson, AZ in the 1970's.

**Niánn Emerson Chase** grew up on four different Native American reservations in the Southwest and, after earning her teaching degree, returned to the San Carlos Apache Reservation where she lived and taught for fifteen years. Since her early childhood, with an explorer's nature inherent in her ancestors Meriwether Lewis and Ralph Waldo Emerson, Niánn has displayed a thirst for knowledge and the character of one who truly loves discovery and the adventure of life. Niánn's background in education, teaching, and counseling is instrumental in overseeing the overall program.



Additionally, the program is rounded out through education and job training where these young people have an opportunity to complete their high school equivalency, as well as learn valuable skills to allow them to compete in the job market. Participants do not use or possess intoxicating substances or tobacco products during their participation in the program.



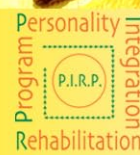
### Staff & Volunteers
